WELCOME TO HARDY'S VERANDAH RESTAURANT

Nestled in East facing slopes of Mount Lofty is abode to some vinous treasures that have been carefully chosen to celebrate all things fine. We welcome you to Hardy's Verandah Restaurant, where we take pride in offering a wine list that pays homage to the rich history of winemaking in Australia. Our list showcases the evolution of grape varieties in the region, highlighting their unique characteristics and the diverse range of styles they inspire.

Established by Arthur Hardy in 1852, Mount Lofty House is the undisputed home for first vineyards to be planted in Adelaide Hills. At the time, these vineyards were the highest planted vineyards in South Australia. In 1858 roughly seven acres were planted with Red Madeira, subsequently there was a planting of Carbonet, Shiraz and Riesling over a nine-acre patch along with Walnut trees interspersed in the vineyard. We honour this legacy of a rich wine history associated with the house by sharing our entire collection housed in perfect, natural cool conditions directly beneath the restaurant in the newly re-excavated cellar.

We live and breathe local and have a special emphasis on the South Australian winescape where wine making has been an integral part of the state's history. The history of grape cultivation in South Australia is closely intertwined with the state's history of wine making. The Mediterranean-like climate, fertile soils, and long tradition of wine making in the region has made South Australia a premier wine producing region. The history of grapes in South Australian wine making can be traced back to the 1830s when immigrant families first began cultivating vineyards. The establishment of the South Australian Company in 1836 precipitated further growth in the region, leading to the development of the Barossa Valley, Clare Valley, Adelaide Hills, and other premier wine-making regions.

Today, our selection features a story of how wine making evolved in Australia. A true appreciation of Australian wines requires a comparison to world-renowned wines, so we have included a selection of international wines that showcase the diversity of grape varieties across the globe. From the old-world charm of Bordeaux wines to the modern, fruit-forward style of Californian wines, our list offers a point of reference for wine lovers who want to explore beyond the borders of Australia.

The natural cellar underneath our restaurant is home to some cult wines from great vintages of South Australia, red of Australia, European classics and emerging new world legends. We also showcase a selection of some interesting alternative varieties.

Join us at Hardy's Verandah restaurant for a journey through the history of winemaking in Australia, as we pay tribute to the pioneers who laid the foundations for the world-class wines that are enjoyed today. We use our selection of wines as an essential tool to pair with the modern South Australia cuisine thoughtfully crafted by our team at the kitchen. This book is our humble attempt to relive the legacy of the grounds we stand on and to take you through a journey that commemorates the past, celebrates the present, and inspires the future.

SPARKLING WINES

The history of sparkling wines in Australia is quite rich. It dates back to 1881 when the Victorian Champagne Company produced its first sparkling Burgundy. In South Australia, it was Edmund Mazure who first began using Shiraz to make red sparkling in Auldana, close to Adelaide in 1893. Iconic wine maker Colin Preece from Adelaide, however made the most exceptional Sparkling Shiraz at Great Western in Victoria. Winemakers till date try to emulate that style. 1950s saw a gain in momentum of Sparkling wines becoming trendy. Wine styles since then emerged and prestige sparkling wines from cool-climate, high-altitude regions took over. With styles varying from sweet Moscatos to creative pétillant-naturals, Prosecco styles to authentic sparkling reds, complex and powerful traditional-method styles to Charmat, Australia boasts a great diversity of sparkling wines.

SPARKLING WHITE WINE

At Mount Lofty Estate we house the highest planted vineyard in Adelaide Hills sitting at 650 mtrs above sea level. We house two vineyards in the south east facing south lawns planted with a single clone of Chardonnay and tiered plantings in the South Lawns with three clones of Pinot Noir. We have partnered with Xavier Bizot from Terre a Terre, bringing his expertise from the Bollinger Champagne family, to tend to our vineyard and the vinification of the fruit. Every year the harvest varies as per the vintage conditions. We present the 2021 vintage right now that sat on lees for over two years and is blend with 55% Pinot Noir and 45% Chardonnay. 'The Estate' is a limited edition bottling we show exclusively at Hardy's Verandah Restaurant for your enjoyment.

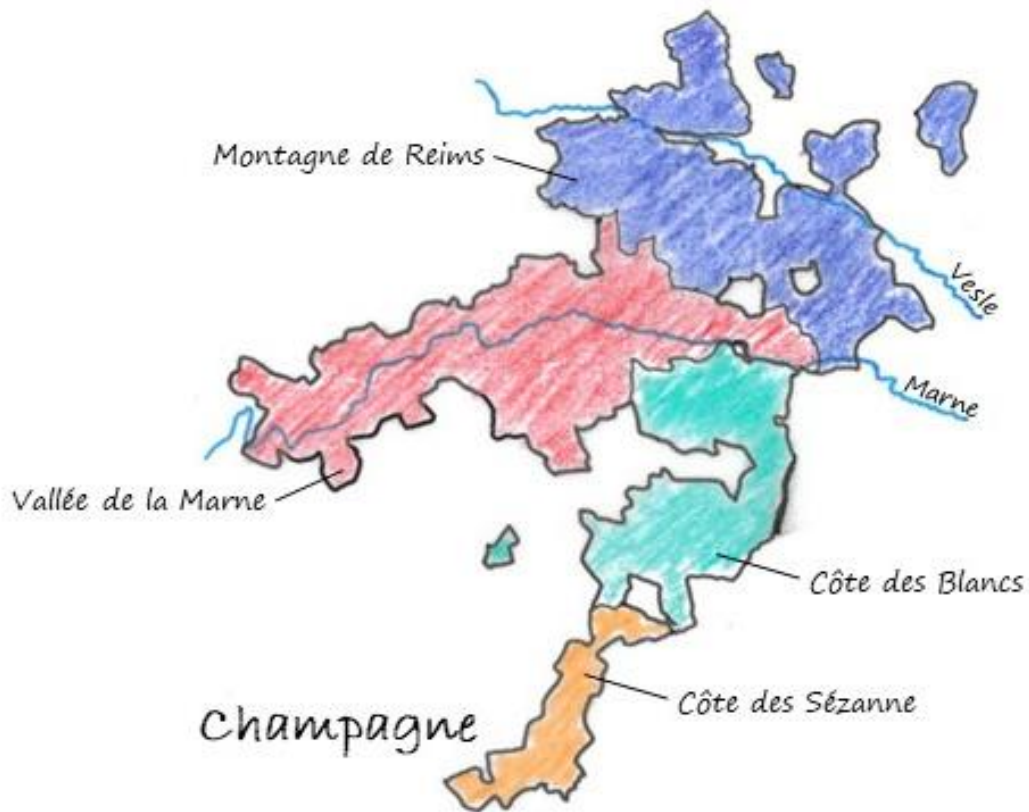

WHITE WINES

White wines were made a little later than reds in Australia. Among the first white grapes that came to Australia were regional favourites like Semillon and Riesling; and the more unconventional Marsanne and Pinot Blanc. They were part of James Busby collection that reached the shores of New South Wales in 1833. Since then, the evolution of white wines has given some of the most iconic styles like Hunter Valley Semillon, Clare Valley Riesling and Adelaide Hills Chardonnay, to name a few. We present our white wines as a collective of some regional varietals to a spotlight showcase on some star grapes. We start our selection of white wines with a highlight on some of the regional varietals that have made a mark on palates globally. We go through various regions and showcase these whites with a stylistic progression.

ORIGINS FROM THE MEDITERRANEAN

Somehow the regions around the Mediterranean enjoy the heritage and history of being the origin for many civilisations and evolution of cultures that have expanded globally since. However, when it comes to wines they have a beautiful versatility that the regions like South of France, some Italian and Spanish counterparts have offered. We take a deep dive into wine styles from these regions that have become a major trend and have become a preferred styles in the recent years. Grapes like Marsanne, Roussanne, Grenache Blanc, Piqupoul and Vermentino (Rolle) are grapes that remain some of the most underrated. But because of this, they are also some of the best value wines. There is rich history with some of these grapes. Tahbilk in Nagambie, Central Victoria have been mastering the varietal since 1860s, sourcing cuttings from Yarra Valley that were planted in 1830s. The true success of these alternative varietals kicked in towards the closing decades of the 20th century, with European Migration dominated by the Italians, helping shape the Australian winescape as we see it today.

SAUVIGNON BLANC, SEMILLON AND BLENDS BEYOND

As with many European varieties Semillon arrived in Australia in 1832 as part of James Busby's collection. It found home in the warm and humid Hunter Valley. Early Hunter Semillon was often labelled as Hunter River Riesling, Shepherd's Riesling, Hock, White Burgundy or even Chablis. It was the lovedale vineyard planted by Maurice O'Shea in 1946, that made vignerons notice the potential of the grape and it catapulted as a favourite since. In the new era aged Semillon, blends with Sauvignon Blanc and Botrytis hit sweet styles have helped Semillon garner the reputation of one of Australia's most exciting white wine discoveries.

Sauvignon Blanc is said to have first grown in the 1800s, but it was only in 1990s that things took off. With the popularity generated by Marlborough Sauvignon in the early 21st century, there was rapid growth in the Australian market. Today there are diverse and unique expressions of the varietal that wineries are working with techniques like wild fermentation, skin contact and fermentation in oak and clay amphora.

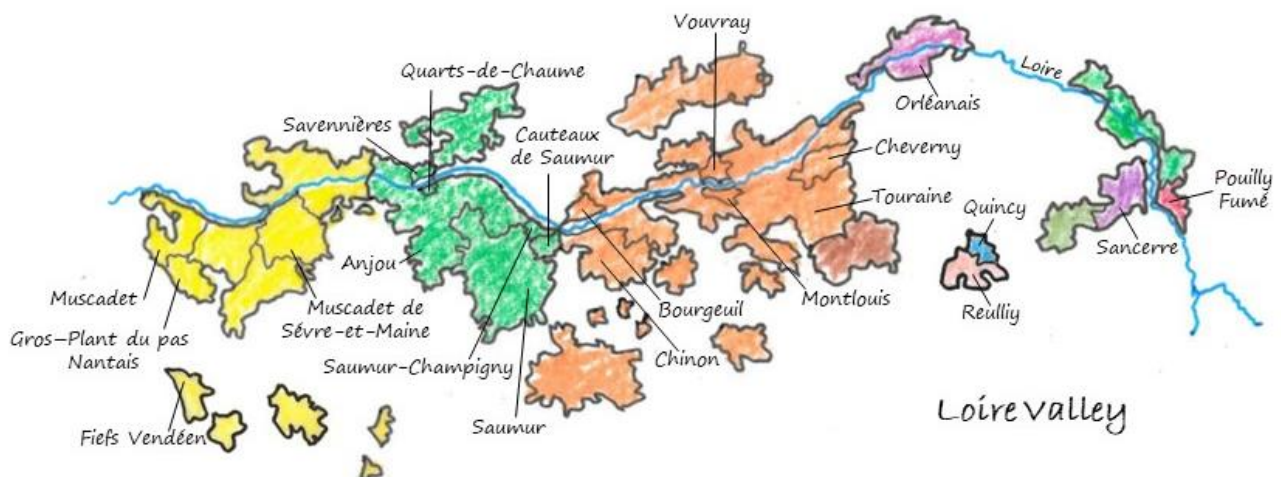
THE CURIOUS CASE OF CHENIN BLANC

RIESLING RENNAISSANCE

First plantings of Rieslings are said to have been brought to Australia by William Macarthur and were planted in Camden Park in South Australia. There are many key figures who have worked hard to create a strong foundation for the grape. Johann Gramp planted some of the early vineyards in Barossa in 1847, Joseph Gilbert planted Australia's first-altitude cool climate vineyards in Pewsey Vale in 1850, Alfred Basedow and Rudi Kronberger pioneered the use of refrigeration for controlled fermentation in 1930s, Colin Gramp introduced the application of cold pressure fermentation in 1953. The rise of Riesling followed the evolution of fine table wine in Australia closely. Piggybacking on the rising popularity of Riesling, many sweeter Australian wines of various grape varieties were mislabelled as Riesling. Despite this setback, Riesling became the leading variety in the white wine boom of the late 1960s and 1970s. Come the 1980s, Chardonnay boom struck and Riesling was taken over as the most preferred white varietal. However, concentrated efforts by large houses and boutique legends like Grosset brought back Riesling to its former glory. Today Riesling is one of Australia's most significant grapes.

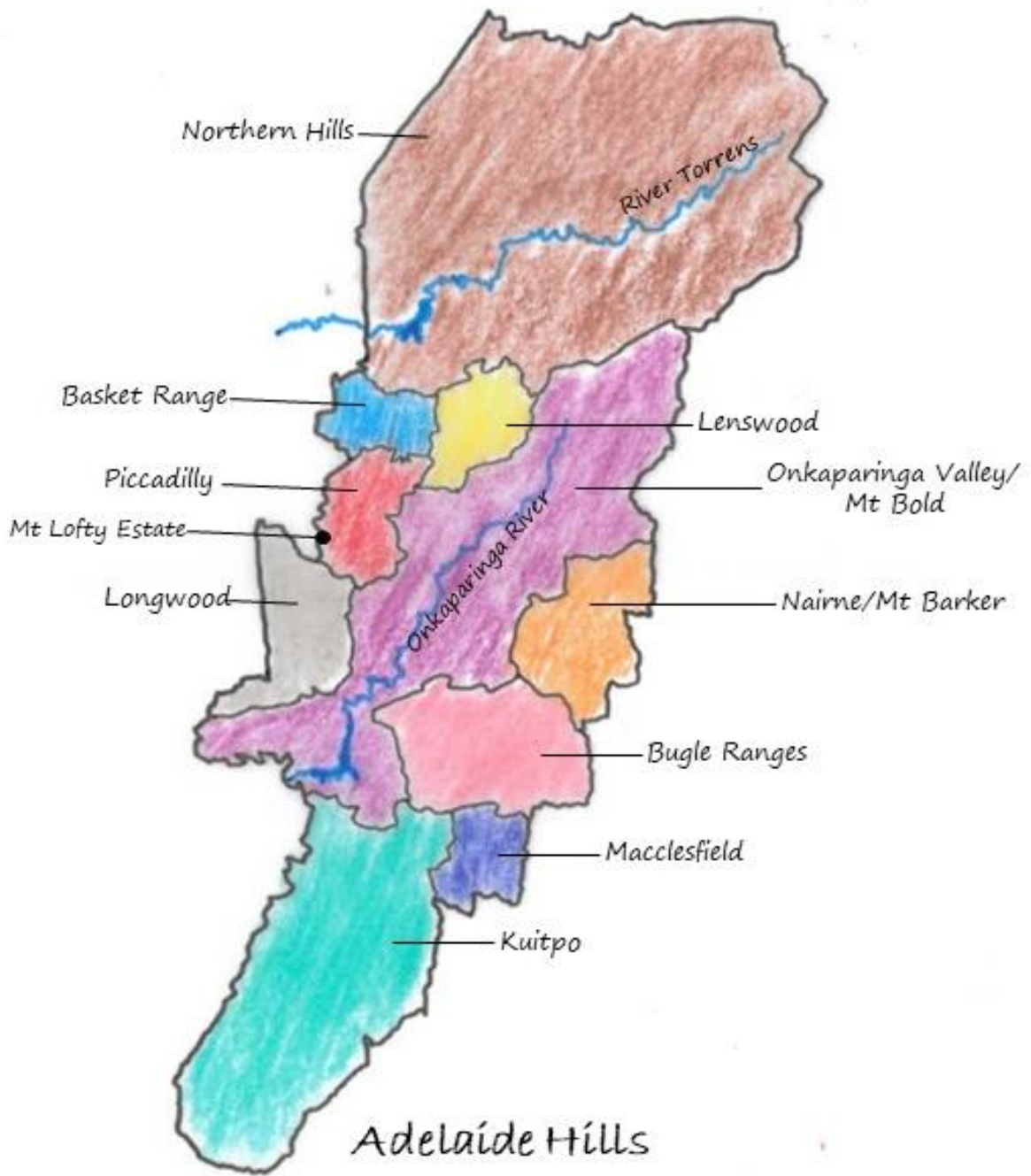

CHARDONNAY: SUNSHINE IN BOTTLE

The exact origins of Chardonnay in Australia can be debated. Some say, it had humble beginnings in 1820s among the first few white grapes planted. Craigmoor in Mudgee, owned by Alfred Kurtz being identified as the best Chardonnay clones with European provenance in Australia in 1969, got some serious attention to the grape. It was however, the work of Murray Tyrrell in Hunter Valley in synergy with winemaker Pieter van Gent from Craigmoor, marketed as a straight Chardonnay, that cemented the varietal in Australia. In 1972, David Wynn from Mountadam Vineyards planted Chardonnay at the highest point in South Australia's Eden Valley. This was the first cool-climate Chardonnay to be produced. In 1979, Brian Croser identified Adelaide Hills as one of the best places to grow Chardonnay. This terroir driven approach on vineyard location catapulted the growth of the industry. The 1980s saw a river of bright yellow, oaky Chardonnay flood the market. This corresponded with the global trend also seen extensively in California. The overdoing of the rich style of Chardonnay led to a dislike among drinkers and thus began the Anything But Chardonnay (ABC) movement. It was early 2000s onwards that more nuanced expressions of the grape- speaking of terroir and true richness of the grape- took over the market.

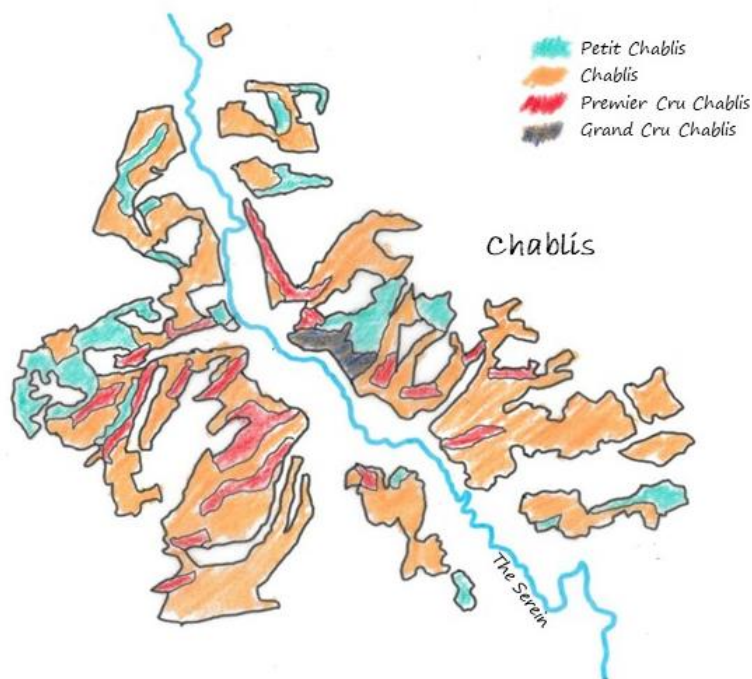

The international journey of Chardonnay, the most widely planted white grape globally, is much older than Australian wines. The earliest documented mention of the grape goes back to the 12th century. There are multiple expressions of Chardonnay ranging from unoaked and vibrantly crisp, to subtle oak and easily approachable, to rich oak and deep concentration, that showcases the versatility Burgundy has to offer with the same varietal. Even with Burgundy considered the birthplace of the grape, there has been a considerable amount of work done across the world to showcase regional expressions. It was in 1976 during the judgement of Paris, that Chateau Montelena 1973 brought the limelight on new world Chardonnay. We however, showcase some of the oldest and most celebrated Chardonnay expressions from Burgundy and the rest of the world to showcase the adaptability of the varietal.

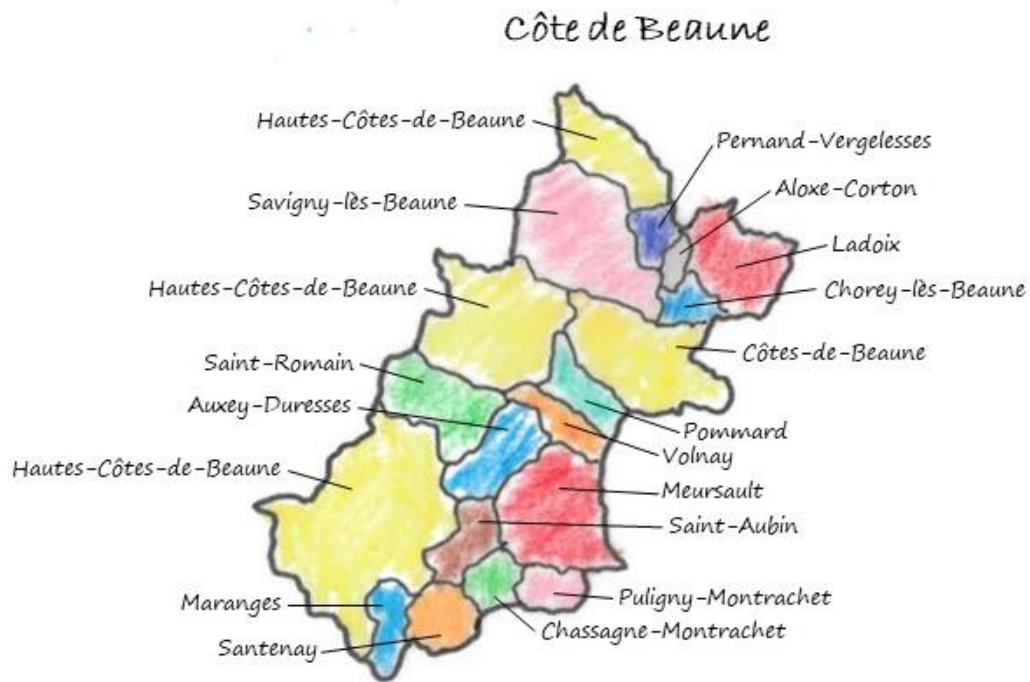

SKIN-CONTACT WINES

These wines are a classic case of ‘everything old is new again’. Skin-contact found a niche with growing awareness of organic and biodynamic grape growing fuelled by climate change concerns. With a history of wine making going back 8000 years to Georgia, the primeval days of winemaking didn’t show a significance to the colour of grape and it was all about flavour and alcohol. In modern history, it is Georgia and neighbouring Armenia that spearheaded the traditional winemaking movement with the use of skin-contact, quveri fermenters, et al. Simultaneously wine makers in Jura have been long known for their under-veil expressions. Sicilian wine growers bringing back the Greco-Roman origin of Sicilian wine and modern Californian wine makers taking inspiration from these movements, show a global outreach of the style. Australia has always been known for being highly innovative and adaptive. Serious wine makers like Vanya Cullen and Kathleen Quealy have worked extensively to introduce a new horizon to the typicity of some of the white varietals.

OXIDATIVE WINES

Many ancient wine making techniques were shaped around the impact of oxygen. Traditional methods left wine exposed to slow impact of oxygen over time. In contrast, modern reductive wine making eliminates air contact with wine often via technology like stainless steel tanks, inert gases, etc. Recently there is a resurgence in the popularity of oxidative wines, may be due to the now global interest in artisanal and ancestral styles of wines. A lot of it can also be credited to the renewed fascination with sherry. From Jura to South Australia, there have been styles of wines that wine makers are actively trying to lead with. These styles have a cult-following, a sublime character and a gastronomic appeal that we celebrate with our selection of some fine examples.

ROSÉ WINES: VIN DE SOIF

Many of the first recorded wines were Rosé wines, light libations made by watering down field blends of combined white and red grapes. In ancient Greece, it was considered civilized to dilute wine. 19th century saw the rise of Rosé wines when tourists drank it to quench their thirst after a swim in the sea, or after a game of Pétanque. It evolved into a sweet infamous expression by the Lancers and Mateus, two Portuguese wineries that created a downward spiral for the style. It was in the last two decades when the idea of Rosé as a serious wine progressed. Here is a showcase of some of Australia's finest along with some classics from Europe.

PINOT NOIR: THE DIFFICULT DARLING

The delicate Pinot Noir is a darling for the Australian wine community, but it has a brief history. Even though early records of Pinot Noir in Australia date back to 1830s, it was only in 1920s when significant production from the legendary Maurice O’Shea in Hunter valley saw the grape finding its feet. Some of the earliest bottlings following this was by Yarra Yerring and Tyrrells. It was in 1950s when Dr. Raymond Bernard introduced the Dijon clones of the grape from Burgundy. It was in the 1980s when the real lift came for the grape. The likes of Stephen George, Mark Whisson and Lindsay Barratt worked tirelessly to promote the grape in South Australia and simultaneously Best’s in Great Western propagated the grape. Pinot Noir has seen an explosion in popularity in regions like Tasmania, Yarra Valley, Geelong and Mornington Peninsula showcasing terroir driven regional expression that are sought after globally.

The King of Burgundy

While in recent years Paul Giamatti's 2004 performance has been associated with catapulting the demand for Pinot Noir, the work of the Cistercian monks and ancient popes surpasses it by leaps and bounds. These monks held a strong belief that 'hard work brings them closer to God' which led them to work a very difficult grape in a region that wasn't part of any major trade route. This led to production of the varietal as a pure expression of quality. Being recorded for centuries around 1000 AD, the idea of land and quality linked to it were the first ever references to the concept of terroir. Pope Urban V refused to return to Rome in the Middle Ages because "You can't get wine like this in Italy". Enough said. We've listed the wines from North to South along various Climats of Burgundy.

Until the success of the Australian table wine kicked in towards the closing decades of the century, the overarching focus of the industry was the French stalwarts and fortified wines. Fast forward to late 1980s, the commitment and enthusiasm to find their unique personality led to some wine styles that were not the conventional big, bold reds or the lighter Pinot-esque expressions, rather a new wave of gastronomic wines.

THE NOBLE NEBBIOLO

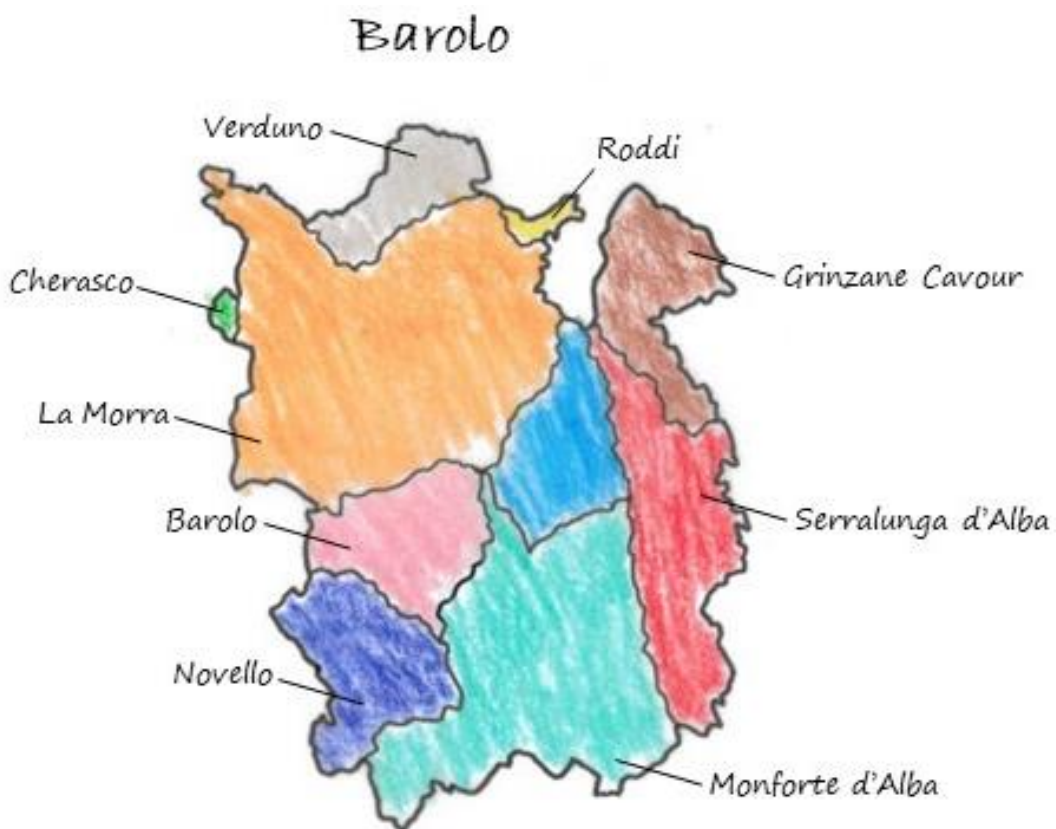
A magician with many tricks up his sleeve is what Nebbiolo can be best described as. You don't know what to expect. An unassuming yet multifaceted varietal that doesn't have long history in Australia. Brought to warmer lands of Mudgee by Carlo Corino in mid 1980s, Nebbiolo has found its true home in Australia in rather cooler climates. The sun loving varietal became a rockstar with Pizzini taking it to King Valley, SC Pannell showing Adelaide Hills as a home for the grape led to Nebbiolo's rise during the newfound love Australian palate developed during the rise of cool climate wines.

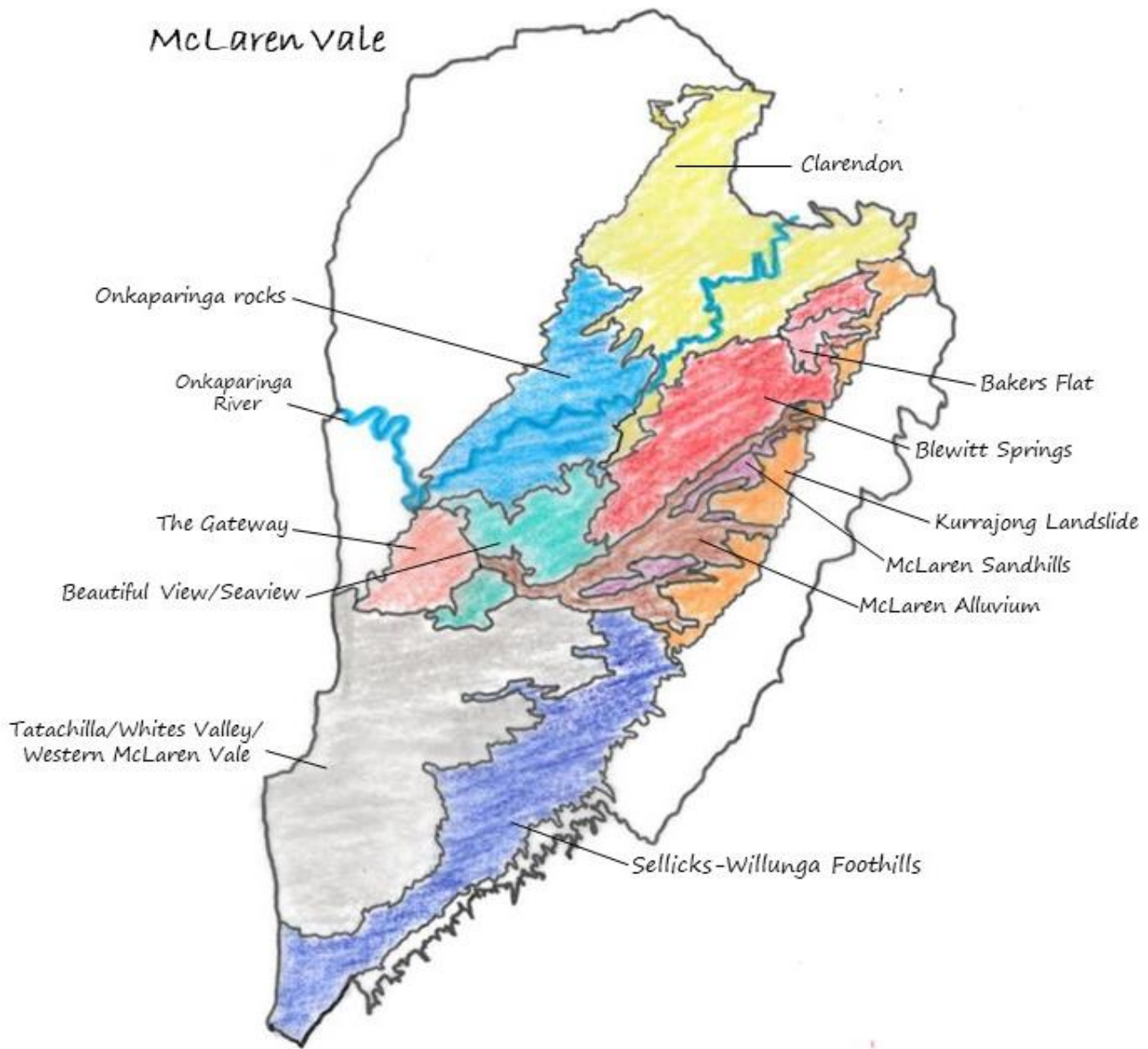
Nebbiolo derives its name from "Nebbia", Italian word for fog. It takes its name from its home Piedmont; a foggy, misty place; especially in Autumn when the Nebbiolo grapes are ready for harvest. The long-time rivalry between Barolo and Barbaresco ended up giving wine paramours around the world, two styles of a grape that cover a spectrum hard to imagine. Nebbiolo doesn't grow extensively across the Italian peninsula and contributes to only 8% of grapes in Piedmont making wines made from the grape often being referred to as "thinking person's wine".

GRENACHE: THE PHOENIX HAS RISEN

Among the Busby collection, one of the 363 varieties that survived and adapted to the botanic gardens of Sydney was Grenache. It soon found its way to South Australia where the Mediterranean climate of McLaren Vale helped the grape flourish beyond any other. It was majorly used for fortified and bulk wine production, however only rarely the word Grenache appeared on a label. A dip from 72000 tonnes of Grenache harvested in 1979 to 15000 tonnes in 2012, the table wine shift in the closing decades of the twentieth century didn't help the varietal much. The work of legends like Charlie Melton in the late 1980s to show the true potential of the grape and its adaptability in classic Rhône blends along with Mourvedre (Mataro) and Shiraz led to the creation of a classic, the GSM. This drew a renewed respect for the varietal and some of the world's oldest Grenache plantations thrive even to date in South Australia.

Once the most widely planted varietal, Grenache is claimed by both Spain and Italy by the island of Sardinia; but its exact origins are uncertain. It is said to have first been cultivated in the 14th century and then gradually spread outwards from the province of Aragon across to Northern Spain and Southern France. Its planting in south of Rhône is what set the stage for Grenache globally. For some time in 17th century, Burgundians were guilty of blending Grenache from the neighbouring Rhône region to improve the flavour of their Pinot Noir. Of course, at the time adding wine from different regions wasn't illegal.

SHIRAZ: AN AUSTRALIAN LEGEND

Early beginnings of Shiraz date back to early 1800s when cuttings including from Rhône valley made way to New South Wales and from there they travelled to Hunter Valley, Barossa, McLaren Vale, Nagambie Lakes and Great Southern in Victoria. Some of the vines planted at that time are still producing fruit and represent the world's oldest continuously producing Shiraz vines. Christian Auricht migrated from Prussia in 1830s and established Barossa's first trading village, Langmeil, home to the 'Freedom' vineyard planted in 1843. In 1860s Tahbilk was established in Nagambie Lakes region of Victoria and the '1860s Vines' survived until today and produce some of the most sought expression of the varietal. Henry Best planted Shiraz and other varieties in his Great Western vineyard in 1867. These vines still produce fruit used in Best's 'Thomson Family' Shiraz. Then there is the work of icons like Johann and Cyril Henschke in exploring the cooler climate Eden Valley Shiraz. Making the many firsts, they introduced single vineyard, single varietal wines at a time when these concepts were unheard of. Max Schubert's work stays immortal with grange being the flag bearer of the Australian Shiraz story world over. The story of Shiraz and its evolution there on has been the true story of the Australian wine industry flourishing. From the 1950s to 1970s the harvest of Shiraz catapulted overtaking Grenache, moving from the bulk wine and fortified wine producing industry to the evolution of the fine table wine producing sector. There was an over supply at a point towards the late 1970s leading to Governments introducing schemes like 'Vine Pull' that encouraged vineyard owners to start replanting vineyards with grapes other than Shiraz or move to a different produce. But here following the lead of Peter Lehmann, winemakers like Robert O'Callaghan from Rockford and Grant Burge stuck to their guns and didn't let the treasure trove of 100-year-old vines die. The industry evolved and in 2000s the rise of cool climate Syrah expressions, positioned Australia as a world-class producer with its cool-climate expressions that allow regional distinction and varietal purity to be revealed, as well as being fine examples of big-flavoured richer, riper styles from warmer regions.

BORDEAUX: THE PAST, THE PRESENT AND THE FUTURE

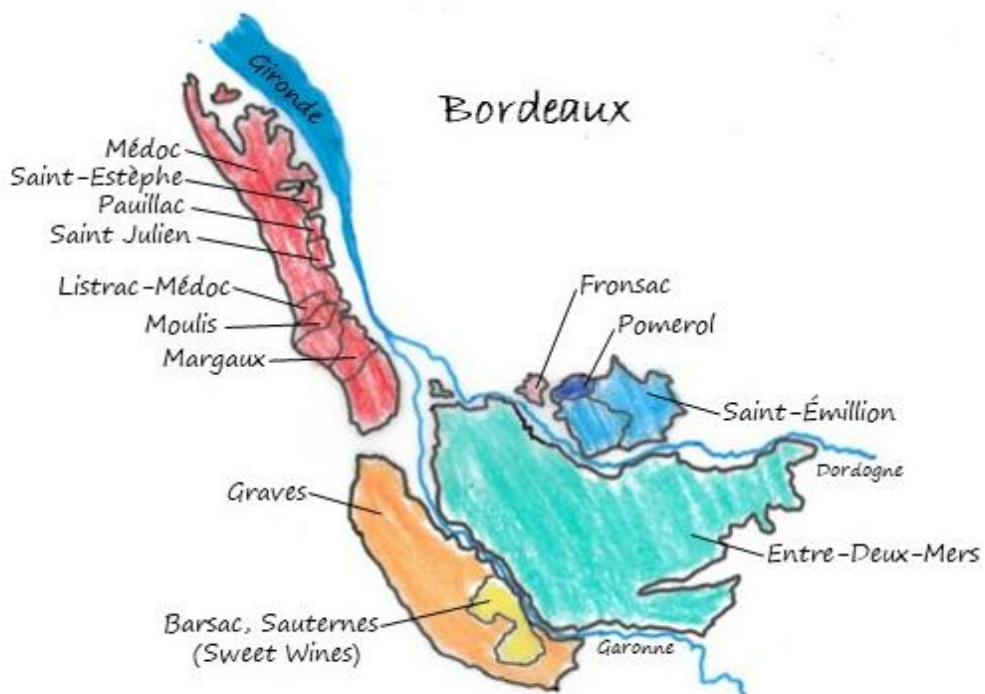
Dating back to ancient Roman civilisation Bordeaux suggests of winemaking happening as early as 1st century AD. A significant step for Bordeaux to gain its foothold in England was the wedding between Eleanor of Aquitaine and the then future king of England, Henry Plantagenet. The wines from Bordeaux served at their wedding led to the increase in popularity of Claret. Over the next millennium, wines from Bordeaux saw an evolution unparalleled. It went through a massive influence of the Dutch in increasing production using technology and infrastructure brought by them in the 16th century, the rise in commercial demands and the 1855 classification to the Phylloxera epidemic that followed. Bordeaux saw a rise and fall and grew from there only resilient. With Robert Parker's review of the 1982 vintage, the en-primeur (a visionary idea to drive prices of a region collectively) sales and Chateaus regaining power over the negociants saw the modern Bordeaux shaping up. In the recent years wine makers in Bordeaux have embraced technology and seen a magnificent change in productions. The significance of Bordeaux in today's market can simply be put forth by saying that success or failure of a Bordeaux futures campaign dictates what happens with the pricing in every other wine region in the world.
